

# SINGLE ROPE TECHNIQUE TREE WEEK

Thanks for your interest in training with  
Tree Climbing Northwest!



The SRT Tree Week is designed for climbers whose focus is on ascending taller trees, those with summit branches at about 80 feet or higher.

The SRT Tree Week Course delves into canopy access, equipment use, and rigging tall trees. We will be on rope for most of the class at heights up to 150 feet.

This is a beginner's course and no previous climbing experience or training is required. However, if you are concerned about fear of heights, we recommend you prepare for this course by first taking the [Basic Tree Climbing Course \(BTCC\)](#) or [Basic Tree Week](#).

Topics include:

- tree selection
- identifying hazards in trees
- gear selection and maintenance
- line placement
- line movement
- methods of ascending
- methods of descending
- self rescue

You will get plenty of time to practice all that you learn, assuring that these techniques are deeply rooted in your “muscle memory.” By the end of the class you will be able to perform a switch-over (changing from ascending to descending while suspended on rope) blindfolded.

This is an intense course and enrollment is limited to three students per class. This guarantees you'll receive plenty of personal attention from the instructor. Because space is so limited, we urge you to sign up as early as possible to reserve your place for the dates you prefer.

This course is physically and mentally demanding. It requires considerable stamina. Your muscles may be sore and you will be tired at the end of each day. And you'll have a lot of fun learning, and with successful course completion, you'll receive a certificate of completion and be prepared to go out on your own to climb your favorite tall trees. Come well rested and be ready for a *tree*-mendous learning experience!

## ENROLLMENT

A minimum of 2 students is required for the course to go forward.

## REGISTRATION and TUITION

Tuition for this course is \$1150 per person (or \$1050 for graduates of Basic Tree Week). Registration with deposit is accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Advance registration is required, and must be accompanied by a non-refundable deposit of at least 50% of tuition. **The tuition balance payment is due two weeks before the first day of the course.**

Tuition refunds minus a \$50 processing fee will be allowed only in the event of an extreme family or health emergency. If the course is cancelled by Tree Climbing Northwest, we will reschedule students for a subsequent session of the course. The tuition fee does not include food, lodging, or transportation to the climbing site.

## YOUTH

Children age 13 years and over are welcome to enroll for the course. A parent or legal guardian must enroll to take the course with children between ages 13 and 15 years. For those aged 16-18 years, a parent or legal guardian must be present during the course, but need not be enrolled.

## HOW TO ENROLL

You can enroll online, or you can enroll manually using paper forms. These are the forms that make up the registration packet:


## MANUAL ENROLLMENT
